This statement is made pursuant to section 54(1) of the Modern Slavery Act 2015 and sets out the steps we have taken to ensure that our business as well as our supply chains are free from slavery and human trafficking during the financial year ending 31/12/2020.

Versalift United Kingdom Limited is committed to preventing slavery and human trafficking occurring in any of its corporate activities, as well as seeking to ensure that our supply chains are also free from such practices.

Versalift United Kingdom Limited is a manufacturer of van mounted and truck mounted hydraulic access platforms working in the Access Hire, Utilities, Telecoms, Local Authorities, CCTV and Facilities Maintenance sectors. We are the sole importers and distributors of Versalift access equipment in the UK and Ireland.

Our key supply chains involve the procurement of mechanical fabrications, electrical assemblies and components combined with GRP, plastic and mechanical fastening components sourced from the UK, Europe and USA.

Our Anti-slavery policy reflects our commitment to implementing and enforcing effective procedures and controls to minimise the risks of human trafficking and other modern slavery practices infiltrating our business operations or supply chains, and to acting ethically and with integrity in all our business activities and relationships.

In order to monitor and mitigate the risks of slavery and human trafficking occurring within our supply chains we will follow our due diligence processes in relation to all suppliers. We also seek to continually review the operations of existing suppliers in relation to the risk of modern slavery and human trafficking.

Versalift United Kingdom Limited will not support or deal with any business knowingly involved in slavery or human trafficking.

The Company Directors and Senior Management shall take the responsibility for implementing this policy statement and its objectives and shall provide adequate resources for training and investment to ensure that slavery and human trafficking is not taking place within the organisation and its supply chains.

This policy statement will be reviewed annually and published.
